

California For All (CFA) Eligibility Checklist

ACCEPTABLE DOCUMENTATION SOURCES

CFA Participants **Must** meet **All the** following eligibility requirements:

- Be a resident of the City of Los Angeles
- Between the ages of 14-30 (see **Table 1 & 2** below for specific program age and eligibility requirements)
- Low-income
- U.S. Citizen, resident, or legal work authorization

And **MUST** meet **ONE** of the following barriers:

- Foster youth (current & former foster youth)
- Homeless youth
- Justice-involved youth
- Difficulty finding employment

Only the documentation sources included in these tables are acceptable for establishing CFA eligibility.
